New Association Members




You won't find this item in any store, or even as an As Seen on TV item. There were only 250 ordered and we don't know how fast they will sell, so if you want one, get your order in soon!

Ready Eddie Plaque Adorns US Naval Museum in Washington DC

During the ships last reunion in Washington, D.C., the Edwards Association had a very impressive and lasting Wreath Laying Ceremony at the Navy Memorial on Friday, July 23, 2005. The Memorial's exhibits brought back long forgotten memories about our years aboard the USS Richard S. Edwards (DD0950) and the Navy Log got shipmates searching for some of our long lost shipmates. That day, after the ceremony, it was decided by all attendees that the Edwards Association would sponsor a Commemorative Plaque to be hung on the COMMEMORATIVE WALL of the Navy Memorial. At the reunion \$1,900 was raised towards the \$2,500. The \$600 remaining was pledged within 30 days of the reunion.

The plaque is a silvaloy plate, 7 X 3-3/4 inches and is engraved with a photo of the Richard S. Edwards and the inscription "Dedicated to all who served with Honor aboard her". The Association officers would like to thank all those who contributed to the plaque for our continuing effort to honor, preserve and celebrate the Richard S. Edwards enduring naval heritage.

The USS Richard S. Edwards Plaque Dedication Ceremony was held Tuesday morning, April

26, 2005 at 11AM at the Navy Memorial on Pennsylvania Ave. in Washington, DC. RADM Richard A. Buchanan, President and CEO had a great message and spoke highly of the "Ready Eddie". CDR John Walker, Commanding Officer of the USS Richard S. Edwards from 1976-1978 was the keynote speaker for the ship and gave the history of the Edwards. Our Association President Bob Tuttle also made some comments. BTFA Cal De Knikker, Association Chaplin, gave the Invocation and Benediction and honored the deaths onboard of SN Louis Garcia and LTJG Burr Johnson. The

ceremony also included the playing of the National Anthem, a showing of the 17 minute film of, "The Sinking of the USS Richard S. Edwards" followed by TAPS as the bow of the ship went under. The group then proceeded to the COMMEMORATIVE WALL for the first official viewing of the plaque.

USS Utah Is Memorialized In Woodland California



On December 7th, 1995, a very special ceremony was held in the city of Woodland, California to honor crew members of the USS Utah, both living and deceased.

The name of the program was "Operation Mahalo".

The project was the brainchild of Navy Veteran and American Legionnaire - Mr. Cal De Knikker. Cal, assisted by his lovely wife Christine, who added to the occasion by singing "*Amazing Grace*" and "*The Star Spangled Banner*."

The De Knickers live on Utah Avenue in Woodland, California.

There was a great turnout at the event, which included former crew members of the USS Utah, Naval Officers, and some of our elected officials. The 10' X 12' plaque, chiseled on a 10.5' X 21' black granite headstone now adorns the De Knickers front yard.
