## Notes from Last Month Newsletter

Michael Wark, 61, of Marietta, passed away after a short illness on Monday (Jan. 28, 2013) in Marietta Memorial Hospital. He was born on April 3, 1951, in Marietta, a son of William J. and C. Pauline Wood Wark.

Mike served in the U.S. Navy during the periods of Nov. 19, 1969 through Sept. 9, 1973 and was honorably discharged with the rank of BM-2 (E-5). He served two tours in Vietnam, one onboard the USS Endurance, a wooden hull mine sweeper and the 2nd tour was aboard the USS Richard S. Edwards, a destroyer. Awards included: National Defense Service Medal, RVN Service Medal, RVN Campaign Medal, Navy Combat Action Medal. Decorations included: Navy Achievement Medal with a Combat V, Navy Meritorious Unit Commendation Medal, RVN Gallantry Cross

Unit Citation, Service Recognition awarded during a firefight and sinking of a NVA Trawler while serving aboard the USS Endurance.

He was a lifetime member of the Elite 115th Riverine Warfare Brown Water Navy, lifetime member of the VFW #5108, Lifetime member of the Disabled American Veterans #WV32, lifetime member of the American Legion #64. He was a member of Faith Bible Church in Williamstown

Most of the old time entertainers were made of a lot sterner stuff than today's crop of activist bland whiners.

The following is from an Army Aviator who takes a trip down memory lane:

"It was just before Thanksgiving '67 and we were ferrying dead and wounded from a large GRF west of Pleiku.

We had run out of body bags by noon, so the Hook (CH-47 CHINOOK) was pretty rough in the back.

All of a sudden, we heard a 'take-charge' woman's voice in the rear.

There was the singer and actress, Martha Raye, with a Special Forces beret and jungle fatigues, with subdued markings, helping the wounded into the Chinook, and carrying the dead aboard. Maggie had been visiting her Special Forces (SF) 'heroes' out 'west'.

We took off, short of fuel, and headed to the USAF hospital pad at Pleiku.

All these dead and wounded to process, there would not be time for your show!"

To all of our surprise, she pulled on her right collar and said "Captain, see this eagle? I am a full 'Bird' in the US Army Reserve, and on this is a 'Caduceus' which means I am a Nurse, with a surgical specialty.... now, take me to your wounded!"

He said, "Yes ma'am.... follow me."

Several times at the Army Field Hospital in Pleiku, she would 'cover' a surgical shift, giving a nurse a well-deserved break.

Martha is the only woman buried in the SF (Special Forces) cemetery at Ft Bragg.

Hand Salute! A great lady.

I did not know this about Martha Raye...

I have been in touch with Cdr. Herman Sudholz and he would like to know who the ET1 was who was onboard in 1971 and 1972.

Can you get his name and email address? I will forward it to him.

I e-mailed in an article on when the Edwards collided with the Bennington off the west coast August 1960-We came up to Seattle to the Seafair Celebration- 4 Tin Cans and 2 Subs-On our way back while refueling from the Bennington we lost steering on the bridge and it didn't transfer to after steering and our bow hit the carrier and damaged the whole port side \$3 million dollars- wiped out the after officers quarters and the gally-took 3 days at 8 knots to get to Long Beach for 3 month over haul- no one was hurt- Mike Treadwell EM2

I served aboard the Ready Eddie in 1964-1965 as Yeoman 3 Class. I left ship as YN2 in 1965. What medals and ribbons can I display. i was the Capt's. phone talker on the bridge during the Famous Tonkin Gulf incident. I saw all of the action. There have been many comments that are incorrect. Yes, we destroyed several of the enemy gun boats. Yes, they fired tracers at us. We destroyed 3 and damaged 1. I have not been able to attend the reunion due to kidney failure and kidney transplant. Please provide me the name and e-mail address of the person who operated the post office during my sea duty. I have been unable to locate any information about Shell Back awards to crew members. Any information will be appreciated.
